We are excited to update you on what we have been doing the past few months and share our next steps as we prepare to go to Panama as missionaries with Grace Ministries International (GMI). We began visiting mission conferences in January and have been to a new church nearly every week. When we visit a church, we typically participate in various activities during the week and then have an opportunity to present our ministry during the Sunday morning worship service. As we travel from church to church, we desire to meet new people with whom we can share our passion and calling to serve the Lord as missionaries in Panama. We realize that going to Panama as missionaries with Grace Ministries International is a team effort. At each church we visit, we invite the people we meet to partner with us through prayer and financial support.



While our travels have been going well and we have really enjoyed speaking in churches and getting to know so many wonderful people, Anthony has been dealing with an infection on and off for many months. With the infection being persistent and the doctors lacking clear answers for dealing with it, it's been a struggle at times to maintain our active schedule. We thank God that He has been faithful during this time, despite this health concern and we are thankful that we have been able to visit with many of you. We value the churches we've been able to visit and the many new friends and ministry partners we've met and ask that you join us in praying for Anthony's health.

On April 28th we celebrated four months of marriage! While living out of suitcases for the first four months of marriage may not be ideal, we enjoy traveling together and visiting with the many people we've met. Spending so much time together in a relatively







short time has helped us in getting to know each other better and adjusting to married life.

Our target date for moving to Panama and beginning our ministry is June 15th or before. Pamela's US visa only allows her to be in the United States for six months and her visa will expire on June 15th. We are excited to begin our ministry in Panama as soon as possible, but we are currently short of our monthly support goal. We are currently about two-thirds of the way to having our monthly financial needs met. The balance of our support must be raised or pledged soon for us to leave for the field by mid-June.

Would you prayerfully consider partnering with us financially so we can leave for Panama by our target date and begin our ministry there? We look forward to joining the GMI team in Panama in growing the work of the Lord there through evangelism, discipleship, and developing leaders within the church. Our heart's passion and desire is to work with the team there to shore up the work that is already taking place as well as expand the ministries and equip the believers so the church can have its own local leaders in place.


